Workshop Overview: Client-Server MAP®



Participants learn how to implement and administer MAP® and/or MAP for Primary Grades assessments. Participants learn how this adaptive assessment measures student progress and identifies instructional needs.

Getting the Most from Your Workshop

Recommended Audience

- This workshop content is intended for staff members responsible for curriculum, instruction, and assessment. For the greatest impact, we recommend that participants include district and school leadership teams, teachers, instructional coaches, and school and district-level administrators. Up to 10 MAP Leadership Team representatives should attend the entire day, including one hour before and one hour after the Main Workshop.
- To maximize participant engagement and retention, audience size should be no larger than 40 participants. Our facilitators incorporate a variety of instructional strategies and stances that engage participants in the learning. The ability to work face-to-face with colleagues and move around the room for various activities optimizes the learning experience.

Recommended Knowledge and Resources

- Pre-workshop online trainings are listed below. It is recommended that participants complete the following online eLearning prior to the workshop: To access online trainings, visit NWEA.org > Partner Support> Professional Development > Online Training.
 - ▶ MAP Basics: For all participants. Covers the MAP system and NWEA assessment basics-foundational knowledge for all workshops. (30 min.)
 - ▶ MAP Proctor Training: For Proctors. Covers the skills, knowledge, and resources necessary for successful proctoring. Training is divided into two sections: proctoring MAP assessments and proctoring MAP for Primary Grades assessments. (30 min.)
 - ▶ Enrolling for a Test Term (CRF/SPF): For CRF Coordinators. Covers how to create error-free CRFs and SPFs and to ensure a timely enrollment process. (30 min.)
 - ▶ Using NTE Admin 2: For MAP and/or Technical Coordinators. Covers how to add new students, upload test results, and download student, test, and school data. (20 min.)

- Setting the Stage: MAP Leadership Team with Facilitator, Part 1
 - ▶ Create a plan to address logistics of the MAP Assessment to share with staff in the afternoon.
 - ▶ Understand the purpose and intent of the workshop
 - ▶ Identify outcomes for using MAP
 - ▶ Clarify roles and responsibilities
- Discovery
 - ▶ Identify key characteristics of MAP (and MAP for Primary Grades, if applicable).
 - ▶ Interpret key reports and access online resources
 - ▶ Review logistics plan from the MAP Leadership Team including roles and responsibilities, and the engagement of key stakeholders including students and parents.

- Reflection and Planning: MAP Leadership Team with NWEA Facilitator, Part 2
 - ▶ Complete planning
 - ▶ Review staff feedback and determine staff learning and implementation needs
